Fri. Nov. 3 Mammals of Ohio, 4 pm

Join the naturalist to closely examine Ohio's mammals with pelts and skulls. Informal program in the lodge lobby.

Sat. Nov. 4 Discover Nuts and Seeds, 10-11:30 am

The naturalist will share nuts and seeds from the Burr Oak forest and help you match them to their sources. Ongoing at the nature center.

Sat. Nov. 4 Fall Color Hike at Strouds Run State Park, 2 pm

Gear up for bird feeding season as the naturalist shares different types of bird feeders and seed types to attract the birds you want! Meet at the nature center.

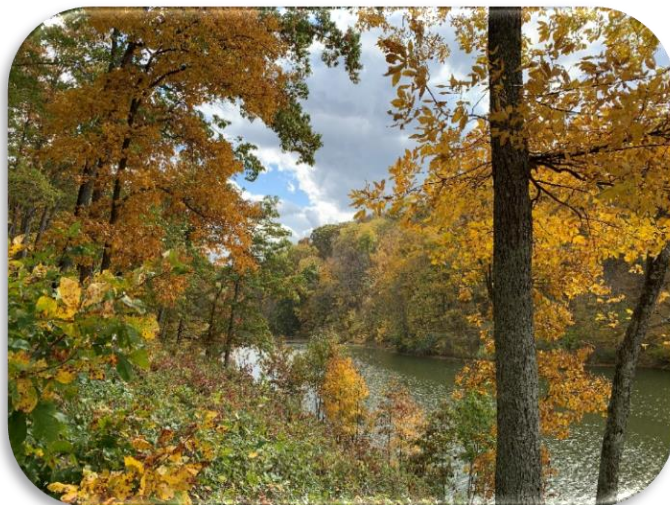
